JOB OUTLINE:**The post is a General Adult Community Psychiatry Post.**ST4-ST6 Training Post in General Adult Community Psychiatry:

The post provides extensive and varied training in General Adult Community Psychiatry, dependent upon the needs and interests of the trainee. The traditional CMHT Service, i.e. the taking of referrals directly from GPs as well the Acute Services in the locality, has been replaced by a Recovery and Well Being Team providing a long term rehabilitation and recovery service to the local population. This is based on the Recovery Model, as well as carrying an assessment and treatment function for new referrals. The job entails assessing and managing patients in the community who are referred by their GP or CMHC staff, under the supervision of the Consultant Psychiatrist. The post holder is expected to be available for home visits or emergency assessment with other team members when needed. Experience in a wide range of psychiatric disorders, will be readily available to the post holder under the new system, and the opportunity is available for the post holder to engage in the care of the mentally ill under different modalities such as standard care and CPA provision. The trainee will be working within a well established multi disciplinary team including CPN's, Social Workers, Community Support Workers (CSW), OT's, Psychologists and Medical Staff

Objectives of Placement**ST4 – ST6 Training Post in General Adult Community Psychiatry**

- ❑ The post is attached to the New Park House ATS at Horsham in West Sussex. There is an expectation that the trainee regularly attends weekly team meetings attended by various disciplines. Trainees within this service have an important and respected role with regards to out-patient assessments for a variety of mental illnesses.
- ❑ The post also provides opportunities for the assessment and treatment of patients with ADHD referred to the Adult ADHD specialist Services for North West Sussex (if desired). Dr Jain is the Adult ADHD Lead Clinician
- ❑ The opportunity to shadow Dr Jain and learn about his role of College Tutor and active involvement in teaching GP and Core Trainees.
- ❑ There will be opportunities to visit the inpatient psychiatric unit at Langley Green Hospital in Crawley and liaise and work closely with the Inpatient psychiatric team. Depending on previous experience, trainees can also gain experience in writing tribunal reports.
- ❑ Research (Clinical Trials at AMHRU). Dr Jain has been a Principal Investigator on many clinical trials in the last few years and has been the highest recruiter in the UK. He is the a Research Lead Clinician appointed by the Trust. There will be opportunities to participate in Research (if desired).

Additional:

- ❑ The post provides for participation in a weekly on-call rota, which allows experience to be gained with Mental Health Act assessments and to discuss issues with juniors and out-of-hours general practitioners;
- ❑ The SpR is expected to attend where possible appropriate management meetings in order to widen their experience of NHS management issues;
- ❑ It is preferable that the post holder is Section 12 Approved and able to drive.
